OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Implementation of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme Livestock Health & Disease Control (LH &DC)-regarding

This is in regard to the implementation the Centrally Sponsored Scheme Livestock Health & Disease Control (LH &DC) with nine components namely (a) Assistance to States for Control of Animal Diseases (ASCAD),(b) Professional Efficiency Development (PED), (c) National Project on Rinderpest Surveillance Monitoring (NPRSM),(d) Foot and Mouth Disease Control Programme (FMD-CP), (e) National Animal Disease Reporting System (NADRS), (f) Peste des Petits Ruminants Control Programme (PPR-CP),(g) Brucellosis Control Programme (Brucellosis - CP), (h) Establishment and Strengthening of existing Veterinary Hospitals and Dispensaries (ESVHD),(l) Classical swine Fever Control Programme. The Scheme is being implemented with change in funding pattern since 2015-16.

- 2. Under the scheme, one of the component is Foot & Mouth Disease Control Programme (FMD-CP) being implemented in 13 States and 6 UTs i.e Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Delhi, Puducherry, Bihar, Karnataka, Kerala, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, UT of Andaman Nicobar Island, Lakshadweep, Dadra Nagar & Haveli, Daman & Diu. Remaining States were yet to be covered under FMD-CP, though efforts have been made to provide financial assistance to the State under RKVY for FMD Control during 2016-17.
- 3. Now, it has been decided to include remaining 16 States and 1 Union Territory i.e. Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Odisha, Sikkim, Tripura, Uttarakhand, West Bengal and UT of Chandigarh under FMD Control Programme (FMD-CP), a component of Livestock Health & Disease Control (LH &DC) Scheme since 2017-18. Accordingly, available funds during 2017-18 under Livestock Health & Disease Control Scheme have been proportionately allocated for implementation of Foot & Mouth Disease Control Programme in the States. Therefore, States may like to take necessary steps for providing adequate budget for implementation of other components of Livestock Health & Disease Control scheme and may avail assistance under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) for control of animal diseases including for the remaining central assistance required for implementation of FMD-CP.
- 4. It is, therefore, requested to advise concerned Departments/Officers for effective implementation of FMD Control Programme in the State by ensuring six-monthly vaccination of all eligible cattle and buffalo population and sero-monitoring as per the guidelines so as to achieve 'FMD Mukt Bharat' in coming years.

The country is free from diseases like CBPP and BSE. In order to maintain freedom status of these diseases each country has to submit a dossier every year to OIE. The dossier is prepared on the basis of the inputs provided by the states. The funds provided under the component has to be utilized for TA/DA & POL/material collection and dispatch of samples to the designated laboratories (BSE):

- a) Physical surveillance in case of CBPP village search, stock route search and institutional search on the lines of Rinderpest.
- b) Collection and dispatch of samples in case of BSE The brain samples from bovines are to be collected and sent to the designated laboratories for testing.
