TRAINING IN ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING

Will the Minister of FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING

be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to impart training to the youths in the field of animal husbandry and dairying, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the number of the youths that have been imparted training under this scheme in the country during the last three years, State and district-wise including Jalore and Sirohi districts of Rajasthan and Gujarat;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to provide loans at subsidised interest rates to the youths on completion of their training in the field of animal husbandry and dairying; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER FOR FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING
(SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA)**

(a) Under Rashtriya Gokul Mission educated Rural Youth are inducted as Multi-Purpose Artificial Insemination Technicians in Rural India (MAITRIs) to deliver breeding inputs and veterinary first-aid at farmer's doorstep. Induction of MAITRIs is done to make available trained manpower for conducting artificial insemination services at the farmers' doorstep in rural areas covering all States and Union Territories.

Under the National Programme for Dairy Development (NPDD) scheme, there is no specific provision for training for youths, however, under this scheme, training is provided to farmers/milk producers on good hygienic/ manufacturing practices, clean milk production, milch animals rearing, adoption of cattle feed, green fodder and mineral mixture, etc.

Under National Livestock Mission there is a component i.e. Extension and Training under the Submission – 'Innovation & Extension'. All sections of society including youth can get the benefit of the scheme. There is no separate information available regarding the youth who got training.

(b) The number of MAITRIs have been trained and equipped to deliver breeding inputs at farmers' doorstep in all states and districts including Jalore and Sirohi district of Rajasthan are 26 and 18 respectively. State-wise detail of MAITRIs is placed at **Annexure-I** and No. of Farmers Trained in Central Poultry Development Organizations (CPDOs) under Animal Husbandry and Dairying from the year 2020-21 to 2022-23 is placed at **Annexure-II**

(c) & (d) As per the revised and realigned guidelines of Rashtriya Gokul Mission 2021-2026 there is no provision of providing loans to the youth on completion of training. However, any private individual entrepreneurs, FPOs, SHGs, FCOs, JLGs, and Section 8 companies can apply for establishment of Breed Multiplication farm with a capacity of 200 cows or buffaloes preferably of indigenous breeds and capital subsidy of Rs.2.00 crore is made available under the component. Further, applicant can also avail 3% interest subvention for Breed Multiplication farms under the Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund.
