



- ❖ Pig population decrease- African swine fever (ASF)\








- Very Good Progress






- Progress- Very Good





Black Quarter disease in cattle & buffalo

- Yak population have increased






- Progess: Critical






- Progress: Very good both completed and progress

- Gini fowl is domesticated for its scenic beauty, meat and egg







Pig, Yak and Mithun status



Important Issues related to Census Exercise

- States/UTs are to complete data collection work by 31st March, 2025.
- Supervisors and above level officers are to be more careful on complete coverage, timeliness and accuracy on data.
- Enumerators may be insisted to follow the maps of villages/wards to avoid any missing of census units.

Issues related to ISS, if any

- Timely completion of ISS data collection is utmost required to analyse and release the season wise ISS data on time. NAD of MoSPI requires these data for their quarterly release of GVA data.
- In order to maintain data quality data collected at enumerator level necessarily be scrutinized at supervisory level.
- Survey 2025-26 will be started from 11th March, 2025. All the States are to update their sampling frame latest by 10th March, 2025. As on date three States namely, Assam, Meghalaya & Tripura have not submitted their updation.
