- 1. Funds under NPDD\_GA\_01D stuck in Punjab & Maharashtra Co-op Bank (Since Sept'2019). No permission has been granted by RBI for withdrawal of funds.
- 2. RBI has informed that GOI has notified the amalgamation scheme of PMC Bank with Unity Small Finance Bank Ltd. (USFBL) from January 25, 2022
- 3. As per the amalgamation scheme, funds parked with PMC bank amalgamated to Unity Small finance Pvt. Ltd have now been converted into equity and preference share.
- 4. Goa Milk Union (GMU) vide letter dated 17.08.2023 requested DAHD to get the share and equity warrants transferred in the name of Government of India as refund of balance unspent and also that the refund the amount of dividend received by them from USFBL, as the amount kept separately and not utilized by them.
- 5. DFS vide DO letter dated 25.10.2024 has informed that **equity is required to be dematerialised first and these dematerialised securities can then be transferred** as per the contractual terms, in accordance with the procedures prescribed under Companies Act.2013 and the regulations/rules made there under.
- 6. Form for opening CNA account of Goa Milk Union in e-Kuber of RBI is still awaited.

- 1. Progress/Achie under Milk Procurement, DCS formation and farmer members enrolment is not satisfactory.
- 2. Two projects are under implementation. NPDD\_MP\_13J approved in FY 2023-24 (PSC dated 11.01.2024) and NPDD\_MP\_14K in FY 2024-25 (PSC dated 29.10.2024).

#### Madhya Pradesh- Issues

#### **Issues:**

- 3. During current FY, an amount of Rs.265.34 lakh was released on 07.11.2024 under NPDD\_MP\_13J (2023-24; Supplementary QMP project) and Rs.1307.30 lakh was released on 12.12.2024 under NPDD\_MP\_14K (2024-25 project).
- 4. However, implementation of both the projects were not taken up by MPCDF/Bhopal Milk Union after the decision of MP Cabinet on 07.01.2025 to hand over the O&M of MPCDF and Milk Unions to NDDB. Out of Rs.1572.64 lakh, Rs.1189.24 lakh remained unutilized and lapsed at FY ending.
- 5. Regular review of project implementation is not done. Last SLTMC meeting held on 09.10.2023. No SLTMC meeting conducted during FY 2024-25.
