MINUTES OF THE 23rd NATIONAL STEERING COMMITTEE (NSC) MEETING HELD ON 27.02.2026

The 23rd NSC meeting of RGM was held under the Chairpersonship of Secretary (AHD) on 27.02.2026 in Krishi Bhawan New Delhi. The list of participants is at **Annexure-I**.

At the outset, the Chairman welcomed all the participants, and it was followed by agenda wise presentation by the Cattle Division to deliberate on the various project proposals for consideration by the National Steering Committee.

Agenda 1: Proposal for establishment of Heifer rearing centres (HRCs)

1.1 Department has received 4 proposals under the component of Establishment of Heifer rearing centres. The proposals were appraised by division as per the guidelines of the Scheme.

- a) Kaira District Co-operative Milk Producers' Union Ltd Anand (Gujarat) – 2 Proposals (Undel & Sarsa Village, Anand Dist.)
- b) Directorate of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Deptt, Assam, Chenikuthi, Guwahati-03, (Assam)
- c) Tamil Nadu Livestock Development Corporation- DLF-Naduvur, Thanjavur District.

1.2 After a detailed discussion, it was decided to approve all the 4 projects received under the component of the establishment of HRCs as per the details at **Annexure II**. It is further mentioned that the release of funds under this component shall be conditional upon each Implementing Agency submitting an undertaking that:

- (i) The HRC will be technically supported and guided by the State Livestock Development Board or NDDDB Dairy Services for formulation of norms and practices to ensure the viability and profitability of the project;
- (ii) The IVF laboratory or service provider proposed to undertake IVF activities in the HRC has been duly identified and indicated; and
- (iii) The Implementing Agency has adequate financial resources to meet the remaining working capital and recurring costs of the project, other than the Government subsidy.

Agenda 2: Implementation of RGM in Sikkim

2.1 SLDB has submitted a proposal for Implementation of RGM with the total cost of Rs. 1115.67 lakh. The project was appraised by Cattle division as per guidelines of the scheme with an allocation of Rs 654.70 lakh. During the discussion State representative has requested for higher allocation of Rs 100 lakh under the component of development and conservation of Yak. State has submitted details of the project and action plan for utilization of funds

2.2 After detailed discussion project was approved with an allocation of Rs. 754.70 lakh as per the details at **Annexure-III**.

Agenda 3: Revision in Annual Action Plan of RGM for year 2025-26

3.1 The Cattle division has prepared the revised Annual action plan under RGM for the year 2025-26 as per the demand received from the States/ UTs and for smoothly release of funds under RGM.

3.2 After detailed discussion Annual action plan under RGM for the year 2025-26 was approved as per the details at **Annexure-IV**.

Agenda 4: Establishment of Breed Multiplication Farms- for information of NSC

4.1 A detailed status of the BMF projects was presented during the meeting by the Division. It was mentioned that out of the 169 originally sanctioned projects, 48 projects have been cancelled and at present 134 projects (121 large farms & 13 small farms) are active projects under the scheme.

4.2 During the meeting following non starters/ Slow Progress in Implementation of BMF projects were discussed:

After detailed discussion, it was decided that NDDB is the Implementing Agency of Breed Multiplication farms and NDDB may take appropriate action and cancel the project as per guidelines prepared by NDDB for release of subsidy.

4.3 Further, it was observed that a few BMF projects at different stages of implementation are not showing any tangible progress in civil work or animal induction since last 9 months despite of repeated reminders. Beneficiary-wise details and their current status as compared to their status 9 months back is given below. In this connection, NDDB had proposed that a deadline of 60 days be granted to all concerned beneficiaries to fulfill the necessary requirements and become eligible for the upcoming tranche of subsidy. It was further proposed by NDDB that, in case of non-compliance within the stipulated period, the projects may be considered for cancellation and the subsidy released may be recovered along with applicable interest.

After detailed deliberations, it was decided that since NDDDB is the Implementing Agency for the Breed Multiplication Farms (BMF), NDDDB may take appropriate action, including cancellation of the aforementioned projects, in accordance with the applicable guidelines and provisions.

4.4 The Committee was informed that guidance is required in respect of certain BMF projects whose beneficiaries have expressed their inability to continue further implementation of the project. It was noted that the following four BMF beneficiaries have completed the civil works as envisaged in the DPR, procured a minimum of 100 animals (i.e., 50% of the total proposed animals under the project), and have availed 50% of the total eligible subsidy:

- a) Dipali Sandip Bhagwat
- b) Sanikommu Anusha
- c) K Vasanth Kumar Alva
- d) Suvir Sharma

After detailed discussion, it was decided that NDDDB may take appropriate action, including mid-way closure of the aforementioned projects, in accordance with the applicable guidelines and provisions.

The Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
