MINUTES OF THE 25th NATIONAL STEERING COMMITTEE (NSC) MEETING HELD ON 24.06.2026

The 25th NSC meeting of RGM was held under the Chairpersonship of Secretary (AHD) on 24.06.2026 at 09:30 AM in Committee Room 243, Krishi Bhawan New Delhi. The list of participants is at **Annexure-I**.

At the outset, the Chairman welcomed all the participants, and it was followed by agenda wise presentation by the Cattle Division to deliberate on the various project proposals for consideration by the National Steering Committee.

Agenda 1: Proposals for establishment of Heifer Rearing Centers (HRCs)

- 1.1 Department has received following 3 proposals under the component of "Establishment of Heifer Rearing Center". The proposals were appraised by division as per the guidelines of the scheme.
- Madhya Pradesh State Livestock and Poultry Development Corporation (MPLPDC) - 2 proposals (Kiratpur, Dist. Itarsi & Ratona, Dist. Sagar)
 - Assam Livestock Development Agency (ALDA), Assam - 1 proposals (Barhampur)
- 1.2 After a detailed discussion, it was decided to approve the projects received under the component of the establishment of HRCs as per the details at **Annexure II**.

- The HRC will be technically supported and guided by the State Livestock Development Board or NDDDB Dairy Services for formulation of norms and practices to ensure the viability and profitability of the project;
 - The IVF laboratory or service provider proposed to undertake IVF activities in the HRC has been duly identified and indicated and
 - The Implementing Agency has adequate financial resources to meet the working capital and recurring costs of the project, other than the Government subsidy.

Agenda 2: Status Review of Establishment of Breed Multiplication Farms (BMF) under RGM

- 2.1 A proposal has been submitted by NDDDB after interaction with BMF beneficiaries on 04.06.2026 to make certain changes in the guidelines of Establishment of Breed Multiplication Farms under RGM. All the major

discussion points during the interaction with BMF beneficiaries were discussed in detail and recommendations are taken on each point.

- 2.2 The recommendations arising from the discussions, along with the amendments to the Guidelines for the Establishment of Breed Multiplication Farms under the Rashtriya Gokul Mission (RGM), are placed at **Annexure III**.
- 2.3 List of BMF beneficiaries who have requested for mid-way closure is also presented and discussed in detail. The list is mentioned below:

- 2.6 After detailed discussions, It was mentioned that NDDDB may constitute a Technical Committee to examine the change requests submitted by BMF beneficiaries and recommend/approve the requests based on technical assessment, as applicable. It was further mentioned that the Technical Committee shall examine and dispose of all requests within one week of the receipt.

Agenda 3: Implementation of RGM in Andaman and Nicobar for 2026-27

- 3.1 Andaman and Nicobar UT has submitted proposal for Implementation of RGM under special project for induction of animals and seeking assistance to the tune of Rs 1439.72 lakh. The project was appraised by Cattle division as per guidelines of the scheme with an allocation of Rs 162.50 lakh.
- 3.2 After the discussion, the proposal was approved with an allocation of Rs 162.50 Lakh (as beneficiary share) for induction of 500 animals during FY 2026-27 as per details given at **Annexure IV**.
- 3.3 It was further suggested that the UT shall avail the necessary technical support from NDDDB to ensure the timely availability of Sex Sorted Semen (SSS), In-Vitro Fertilization (IVF) services, and other support required for the successful implementation of the project. Further, all animals inducted under the project and their subsequent progenies shall be registered and data updated on the Bharat Pashudhan portal to facilitate end-to-end digital monitoring, traceability, performance tracking and breeding records.

Agenda 4: Establishment of IVF Lab in Dudhsagar Dairy, Mehsana, Gujarat

- 4.1 Dudhsagar Dairy, Mehsana, Gujarat has submitted proposal for establishment of IVF Lab with total project cost of Rs 4055.22 lakh. The project was appraised by appraisal committee and Cattle division as per guidelines of the scheme with the total project cost of Rs 861.00 lakh.
- 4.2 After detailed discussion, the proposals for establishment of IVF Lab at Dudhsagar Dairy, Mehsana, Gujarat was approved with an allocation of Rs. 861.00 Lakh for FY 2026-27 as per details given at **Annexure V**.

Agenda 5: Implementation of Artificial Insemination Program in NER under RGM (2026-27)

- 5.1 The cattle division has submitted the detailed proposal for implementation of NER Artificial Insemination Programme under RGM for year 2026-27. It was mentioned that the assessed outlay for the project is Rs. 3343.68 Lakh for the year 2026-27.
- 5.2 After the discussion, the proposal was approved with an allocation of Rs 3343.68 Lakh for the year 2026-27 as per details given at **Annexure VI**.

Agenda 6: Continuation of projects during 2026-27 (upto Sept 2026)

- 6.1. Cattle Division submitted the proposal for continuation the following projects:
- a) Continuation of Progeny Testing Pedigree Selection Programme as per guidelines of the scheme, with same cost norms (Unit cost Rs 60000/bull) and Target for production of 500 bulls.

b) Continuation of National Milk Recording Programme (NMRP) as per guideline of the scheme, with same cost norms (Unit cost Rs 4500/animal) and Target to bring 25000 animals under milk recording.

c) Genomic Testing of all bulls in semen stations and all female covered under NMRP and PT/PS Programme (Unit cost Rs 3360/animal including sample collection, biobanking etc.).

6.2. After detailed discussion it was decided to approve continuation of the aforementioned projects upto Sept 2026 with same cost norms.

Agenda 7: Ratification on cancellation of Breed Multiplication farms

7.1 The list of the BMF projects for ratification is placed at Annexure VII.

7.2 After detailed discussion, the NSC approved the proposal for cancellation of the said 14 Breed Multiplication Farms. It was further decided that the and all necessary consequential actions shall be taken by the NDDDB in accordance with the guidelines and provisions of the Scheme.
