**Subject: Regulation of import of live animals under the Livestock Importation Act, 1898 and amendments made from time to time - regarding.**

For "**Ease of Understanding and Doing Business**" as well as streamlining the complete process of import of live animals into India by the importers, the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) were issued vide this Department's O.M. of even number, dated 15 July 2020 (**copy enclosed**).

2. The SOPs were displayed on website of the department and the comments were also invited from general public / stakeholders. SOPs are already in vogue and in practice at the implementation stage at ground level and finally it will evolve with the experience, feedback and the emergent requirement over the time. The comments / suggestions, received from the stakeholders / importers have been examined which does not suggest any improvisation in these SoPs. Wherever required, the evolving features would be incorporated while making online system shortly.

3. The Veterinary Health Certificate formats as stated in these SOPs are Indian standard protocols. However, the bilaterally agreed Veterinary Health Certificates will be acceptable, wherever applicable.

**OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

**Subject: Regulation of import of live animals under the Livestock Importation Act, 1898 and amendments made from time to time - regarding.**

This Department is regulating import of live animals under the Livestock Importation Act, 1898. The procedures for import of live animals into the country has been notified vide S.O. (1495), dated 10.06.2014 and as amended from time to time.

2. It has come to notice of this Department that a few pet owners are facing various difficulties on account of lack of requisite documents after importing pets into India for quarantine clearance. Therefore, henceforth, the final "No Objection Certificate" by the concerned Animal Quarantine and Certification Service (AQCS) shall be issued to imported pets (pet dogs and cats) at the port of entry itself. In case, any disease symptom(s) is/are found during physical examination at Port of Entry, the quarantine of imported pets shall be done at concerned AQCS. All such cases of quarantine of imported pets will be reported to DAHD with details and justifications. The information will be addressed to Secretary (AHD), AHC and JS(Trade).


3. For "**Ease of Understanding and Doing Business**" as well as streamlining the complete process of import of live animals into India by the importers, the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs); Process for import; Application Form for obtaining advance No Objection Certificate from AQCS; Veterinary Health Certificate format to fulfil Indian requirements; format for advance No Objection Certificate; format for Physical Examination of Pet at port of arrival; format for Physical Examination of the pet/ animals during Quarantine period at AQCS; format for final No Objection Certificate, etc. have been standardized for import of live animals including pets into India and are **annexed** herewith. The details of post-import tests and name of laboratories where required tests will be done, has also been mentioned.

4. It is to clarify that the concerned AQCS will inspect only those documents which pertain to veterinary health requirements. The other documents/ licenses, which are required under various rules & regulations of other Departments including Customs, shall be inspected by the Customs authorities. The process as depicted in the annexure shall be implemented physically till the development of an on-line portal in this regard. Further, the communication with importers shall essentially be made through email in all cases to the extent feasible.

5. The Standard Procedures and formats will come into force with immediate effect. However, the comments / suggestions on the SOPs are also invited from the stakeholders / importers for further improvisation, if any. 

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## **Standard Operating Procedure for Import of Pet Dog(s) in to India:**

### **Pre Arrival Requirements:**

1. Minimum 07 days before embarkation, the application form (Annexure 1.1) will be submitted through email / physically by the applicant.
2. After examining the uploaded forms, Advance No Objection Certificate (NOC-Annexure 1.2) will be issued by the concerned Animal Quarantine & Certification Station (AQCS) within 1 working day along with parameters to be examined on arrival (Annexure 1.3).

### **On Arrival at the Port of Entry**

1. The AQCS's Officer will carry out physical examination of the dog(s) as per the prescribed format (Annexure 1.3) at the port of entry.
2. In case the dog(s) is/are found sound and healthy (as per the Annexure 1.3), final NOC (Annexure 1.5) will be issued at the port of entry itself.
3. In case the dog(s) fails to clear physical examination or exhibits clinical signs of diseases mentioned in format at annexure 1.3, it will be taken to the Quarantine Station and will remain under quarantine for 15 days.

### **During Quarantine Period at AQCS**

1. Everyday examination record (Annexure 1.4) will be maintained and testing will be done as per annexure 1.3. If any signs/symptoms will be found, the same will be recorded or updated online. The applicant will bear the charges for testing.
2. Final NOC (Annexure 1.5) will be issued in case negative test reports are obtained for the dog(s) under quarantine.
3. In case of the positive testing reports or if the pet dies of disease, deportation/Post –Mortem and incineration will be done at the cost of owner.

**\*Complete process of clearance is depicted at annexure 1a, 1b and 1c.**

Note: If owner of pet(s) is unable to visit Animal Quarantine & Certification Services personally for the purpose of obtaining No Objection Certificate (NOC), physical examination of dog(s) etc., he/she may authorize his/her representative (Annexure 1.6).

**Process for Importing Pet Dog(s) into India under Transfer of Residence- Ease of Understanding**

**Case 1. – Transfer of Residence**

**Application Filing**

Minimum 7 working days before embarkation, applicant will submit the following documents for Advance No Objection Certificate (NOC) from AQCS;-

Before filling application, please make sure that you are eligible for Transfer of Residence (Proof of two years overseas stay and visa cancellation/relocation proof)

Application form (Annexure-1.1)

**Provisional Decision**

If documents are proper

Advance No Objection Certificate (Annexure-1.2) along with format for physical examination (Annexure 1.3) is issued and Bill of Entry will be cleared online by AQCS (If coming by cargo)

If there is deficiency in documents

Applicant will be informed back with point wise reasons for rejection (automatic response by system).

Airline will not lift the dog(s) until advance NOC is obtained by the applicant.

**Post Arrival Examination**

Quarantine Officer will examine the animal(s) as per the prescribed format (Annexure 1.3) and documents

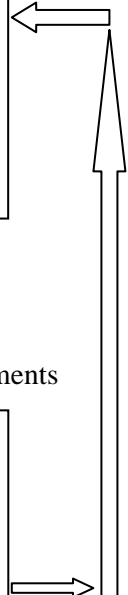

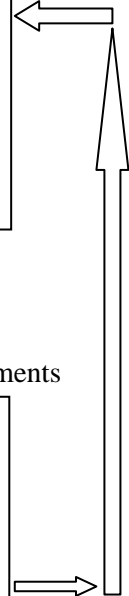

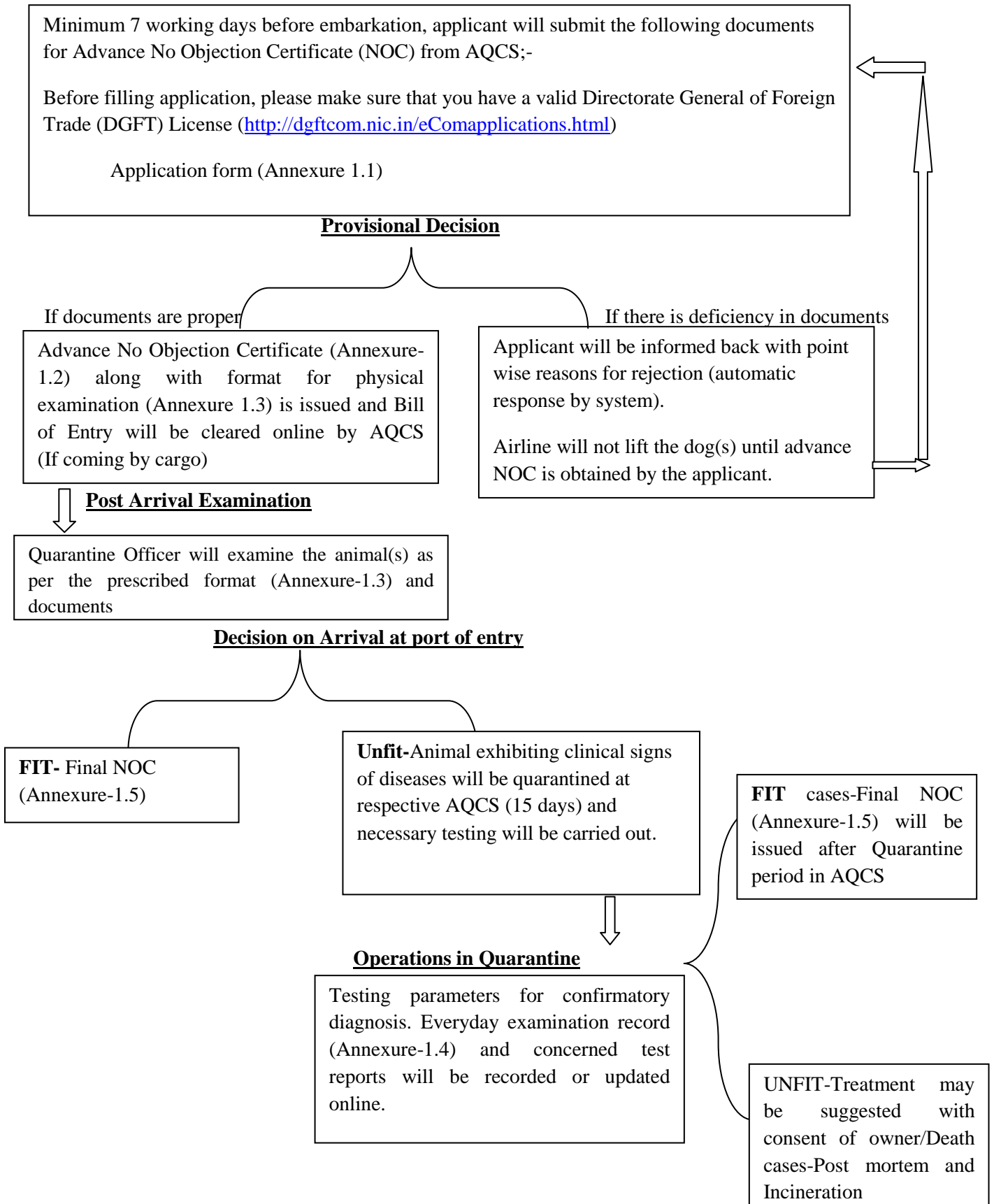

### **Pre Arrival Requirements:**

1. Minimum 07 days before embarkation, the application form (Annexure 1.1d) will be submitted through Email by the applicant. Pet passport is not required in case of Commercial dog(s).
2. After examining the uploaded forms, Advance No Objection certificate (NOC-Annexure 1.2d) will be issued by the concerned Animal Quarantine & Certification Station within 1 working day.

### **On Arrival at the Port of Entry**

1. Commercial dog(s) will be quarantined for 15 days at respective AQCS premises or in house quarantine approved by Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying (DAHD), New Delhi.

### **During Quarantine Period at AQCS**

1. Everyday examination record will be maintained and testing will be done as per annexure 1.4d. If any signs/symptoms will be found, the same will be recorded or updated online. The applicant will bear the charges for testing.
2. Final NOC (Annexure 1.5d) will be issued in case negative test reports are obtained for the commercial dog(s) under quarantine.

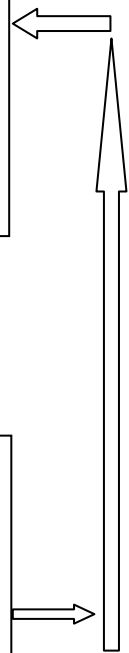

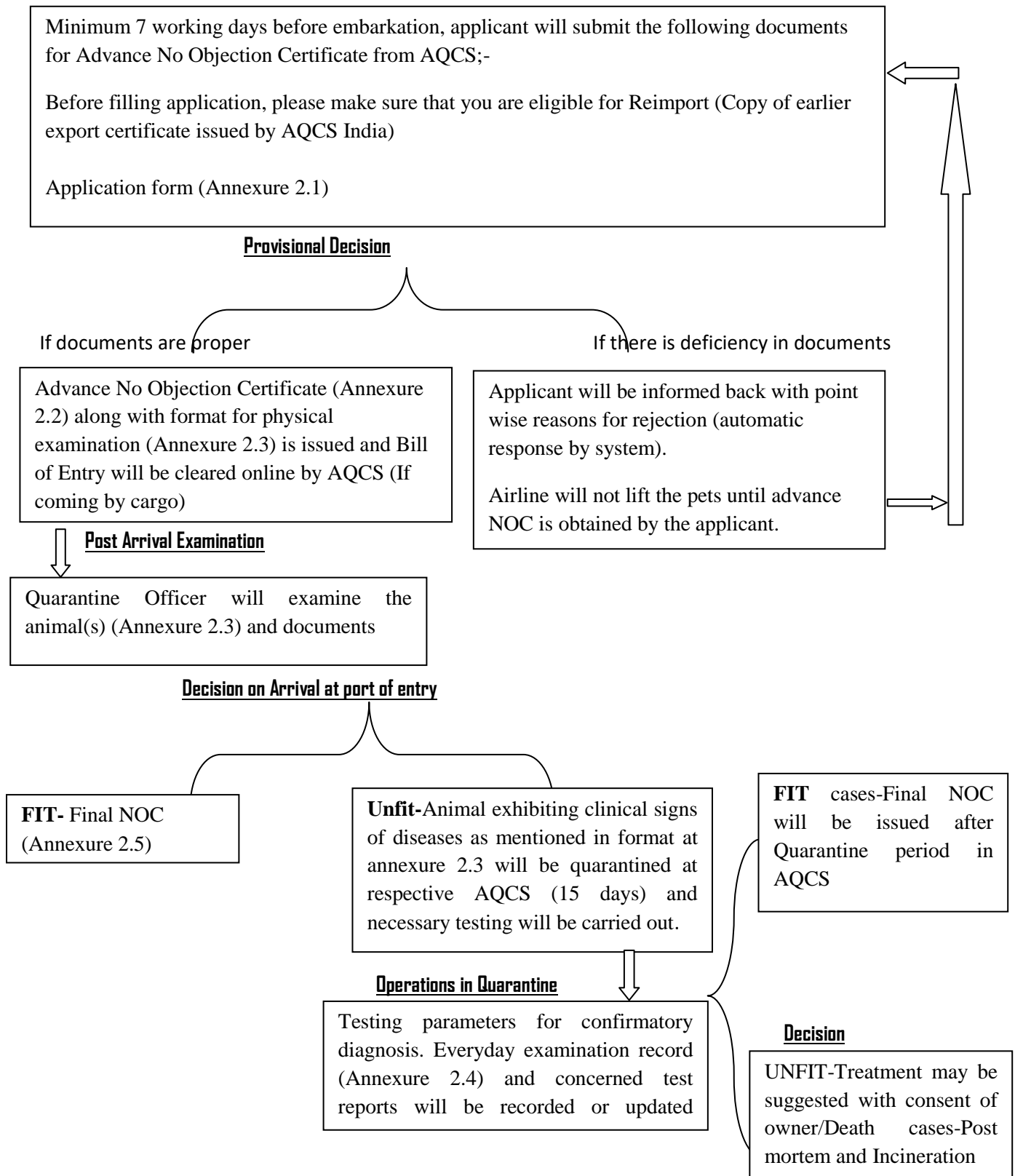

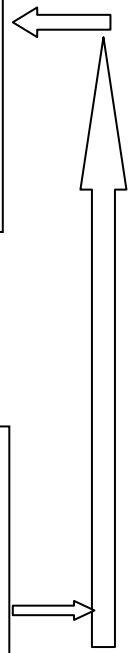

## Annexure 3.1.1

### Veterinary health certificate for import of horses or other equidae into India,

(\*\*As published in Gazette Notification S.O. 752 (E), dated 5<sup>th</sup> October, 2012 and subsequent amendment vide in Gazette Notification S.O. 185 (E), dated 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2013)

1. General requirement: The horse or other equidae shall be accompanied with a valid passport or if the horse or other equid is not originating from countries not issuing passport, it must be accompanied by a complete history sheet with an identification certificate duly authenticated by an official veterinarian of the exporting country.

2. In the case of thoroughbred horses, import shall be allowed for the purpose of breeding, polo and sports only and not for purpose of racing.

3. Testing requirement:

(1) The horse or other equidae shall come from a country, -

(i) where the African Horse Sickness Virus (AHSV) has not been reported for the last two years preceding the exportation;

(ii) free from African Horse Sickness Virus (AHSV) when African Horse Sickness (AHS) is a notifiable disease in the whole country, systematic vaccination is prohibited, importation of equids and their semen, oocytes or embryos are carried out in accordance with Chapter 12.1 of Terrestrial Animal Health Code of World Organization for Animal Health (OIE);

(iii) where the horse or other equidae have not travelled to or through any country infected with African Horse Sickness for the last two years preceding the exportation;

(iv) with a certificate of veterinary authorities certifying the horse or other equidae -

(a) have not shown any clinical signs of African Horse Sickness (AHS) on the day of shipment;

(b) have not been vaccinated against African Horse Sickness (AHS) forty days immediately preceding the exportation;

(c) were protected from culicoides attacks at all time when transiting through an infected zone.

(v) where Contagious Equine Metritis (CEM) has not been reported during the last twenty months preceding the exportation.

Provided that the import of the horse or other equidae from Contagious Equine Metritis (CEM) infected country shall be allowed if the horse or other equid have been kept in an establishment or farm (by whatever name called) which is free from Contagious Equine Metritis (CEM) for three years preceding the exportation and the horse or other equidae have not been mated during last thirty six months preceding the exportation:

Provided further that if the horse or other equidae has been mated within an establishment or farm (by whatever name called), they shall test negative from Contagious Equine Metritis (CEM) on three consecutive occasions each not less than seven days intervals for stallions and pregnant mares, and on three consecutive oestruses for non-pregnant mares.

(vi) After undergoing pre-export quarantine for necessary testing as per Table annexed to the veterinary health certificate, prior to the export.

(2) The horse or other equidae shall be imported only through the International airports at Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai and Chennai or any other airports notified by the Central Government from time to time.

(3) The importer shall submit all the test reports after completion of the tests indicated at the Table along with a copy of health certificate to the Regional Officer or Quarantine Officer of the Animal Quarantine and Certification Services attached to the airports, seven days (relaxable up to three days in pressing circumstances) prior to the embarkment and shall obtain No Objection Certificate (NOC).

(4) The horse or other equidae shall be allowed to disembark only on the receipt of an original No Objection Certificate (NOC).

4. Special Requirement - No horse or other equidae shall be imported into the country unless certified by a certificate of health in English language signed by an official veterinarian licensed and accredited by the exporting state or country in which a physical examination of the same was made as per the below mentioned Form.

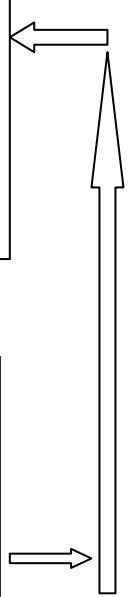

c) was isolated in the establishment of origin or a quarantine station, and were subjected to a serological test to the whole AD virus, with negative results, on two occasions, at an interval of not less than 30 days between each test, the second test being performed during the 15 days prior to shipment.

**(3) African swine fever (ASF):**

The country is free from African Swine Fever (ASF); or

the animal showed no clinical sign of ASF on the day of shipment and were kept in an ASF free country or zone since birth or for at least the past 40 days.

**(4) Transmissible Gastro Enteritis (TGE)**

The live animal showed no clinical sign of TGE on the day of shipment; and either

a) come from an establishment in which no case of TGE was reported during the 12 months prior to shipment; and

b) showed negative results to a diagnostic test for TGE during the 30 days prior to shipment, and were kept isolated during this period; or

c) come from a country in which TGE is officially notifiable and no clinical case has been recorded in the previous three years

**(5) Classical Swine Fever (CSF)**

a) showed no clinical sign of CSF on the day of shipment;

b) were kept in a country, zone or compartment free from CSF since birth or for at least the past three months;

Or

were kept since birth or for the past three months in a CSF free compartment;

3) have not been vaccinated against CSF, nor are they the progeny of vaccinated sows, unless there are means, validated in accordance with the Terrestrial Manual, of distinguishing between vaccinated and infected pigs. or

**(6) Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome (PRRS):**

(i) If the country (name of the country) is not free from Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome (PRRS) virus:

a) the animal has been sourced from the zone (name of the zone free from PRRS virus).  
or,

b) has been obtained from the establishment (name and address of the establishment) that are free from PRRS for last two years and the establishment is under continuous surveillance programme by the veterinary authority of the exporting country. All biosecurity measures are undertaken in the establishment as per the OIE principles.

**(7) Porcine Brucellosis (Brucella means the Brucella species as defined in Terrestrial Animal Health Code):**

showed no clinical sign of infection with Brucella on the day of shipment; either

a) originate from a herd free from infection with Brucella; OR

b) originate from a herd in which a statistically valid sample of the breeding pigs, selected in accordance with existing Terrestrial Animal Health Code of OIE., was tested within 30 days prior to shipment, demonstrating the absence of infection with Brucella; OR

c) were isolated for 30 days prior to shipment and all pigs in isolation were tested for infection with Brucella within that period with negative results.

The animal has been sourced from the establishment which has not reported Porcine Epidemic Diarrhoea for last 40 days and no animals from PED infected establishments was introduced in such and establishment from where the animals were sourced for export to India.

1. Minimum 07 days before embarkation, the application form (Annexure 5.1) will be submitted online by the applicant.
2. After examining the uploaded forms, Advance No Objection certificate (NOC Annexure 5.2) will be issued by the concerned Animal Quarantine and Certification Services.

### **On Arrival at the Port of Entry**

1. The Sheep/Goat(s) will be taken to the Quarantine Station and will remain under quarantine for 30 days.

### **During Quarantine Period at AQCS**

1. Everyday examination record (Annexure 5.3) will be maintained and testing reports (against Border Disease, CAE, Crimean-Congo Haemorrhagic Fever, SVI, RVF and NSD) will be updated online. Samples will be drawn during 2<sup>nd</sup> week. The applicant will bear the charges for testing.
2. Final NOC (Annexure 5.4) will be issued in case negative test reports are obtained for the Sheep/Goat(s) under quarantine.
3. In case of the positive testing reports, deportation will be done at the cost of owner. If Sheep/Goat(s) dies, Post –Mortem and destruction will be done at the cost of owner.

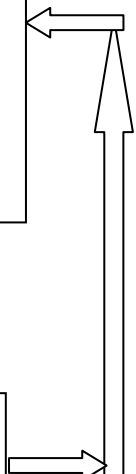

or

The Country/ zone and compartment is free from Foot and Mouth Disease (SAT 1,2,3 and C) with vaccination and the animals fulfills the requirements as prescribed in Article 8.8.11 of Terrestrial Animal Health Code of OIE, or

(b) the Country is not free from FMD but the FMD strain is prevailing in the Country other than (O,A and Asia 1) and the Official Control Programme in Place recognized by OIE. The animals sourced from the Country/Zone that fulfills the requirements as prescribed in Article 8.8.12 of Terrestrial Animal Health Code of OIE.

#### **D. Pesti des petits ruminant**

(a) The Country/zone is free from PPR and the animals were kept in the PPR free country and zones for 21 days before shipment and showed no symptoms for PPR on the day of shipment,

or;

(b) the Country or zone is not free from PPR and the animals fulfil the requirements as per Article 14.7.10 of Terrestrial Animal Health Code of OIE.

#### **E. Contagious Agalactia**

The animals showed no clinical sign of contagious agalactia on the day of shipment and were kept since birth or for the six months prior to shipment in an establishment where no case of contagious agalactia was officially reported during that period; and also were kept in a quarantine station for the 21 days prior to shipment.

#### **G. Border's Disease**

The animals were sourced from the Country or Zone or compartment free from Border's disease and the animals have not shown the shredding of virus when tested with RT-PCR before entering into the pre-export quarantine.

#### **H. Rift Valley Fever**

The animals were sourced from the country or zone free from RVF and the animals fulfil the requirements as prescribed in Article 8.15.7 or the animals sourced from the country or zone not free from RVF and the animals fulfils the requirements of Article 8.15.8 or 8.15.9 as the case may be.

#### **I. Caprine Arthritis /Encephalitis**

(i) The animals showed no clinical sign of caprine arthritis/encephalitis on the day of shipment;

(ii) animals over one year of age were subjected to a diagnostic test for caprine arthritis/encephalitis with negative results during the 30 days prior to shipment; or

(iii) caprine arthritis/encephalitis was neither clinically nor serologically diagnosed in the sheep and goats present in the flocks of origin during the past three years, and also that no sheep or goat from a flock of inferior health status was introduced into these flocks during that period.

#### **J. Contagious Caprine Pleuro Pneumonia (CCPP)**

(i) The animals were kept in a CCPP free country since birth or for at least three months and the animal showed no signs of CCPP or



- (ii) were subjected to a complement fixation test for CCPP with negative results, on two occasions, with an interval of not less than 21 days and not more than 30 days between each test,
- (iii) were isolated from other domestic goats from the day of the first complement fixation test until shipment;
- (iv) were kept since birth, or for at least the past 45 days, in an establishment where no case of CCPP was officially reported during that period, and that the establishment of origin was not situated in a CCPP infected zone;

#### **K. Enzootic Abortion of Ewes (EAE) (Ovine Chlamydiosis)**

- (1) The animals remained since birth, or for the previous two years, in establishments where no EAE was diagnosed during the past two years;
- (2) showed no clinical sign of EAE on the day of shipment;
- (3) were subjected to a diagnostic test for EAE with negative results within the 30 days prior to shipment

Or

The flocks from where the animals have been sourced are free from EAE and satisfies the following:

- (1) The flock was under official veterinary surveillance;
- (2) all sheep and goats showed no clinical evidence of EAE infection during the past two years;
- (3) a statistically valid number of sheep and goats over six months of age were subjected to a diagnostic test for EAE with negative results within the past six months;
- (4) all sheep or goats are permanently identified;
- (5) no sheep or goat has been added to the flock since 30 days prior to the flock test referred to in point 3) above unless:
  - (a) either the additions were isolated from other members of the flock in the establishment of origin for a minimum period of 30 days and then were subjected to a diagnostic test for EAE with negative results, before entry into the new flock; or
  - (b) they originated from an establishment of equal health status

#### **L. Maedi-Visna**

- (1) the animals were sourced from the country free from Maedi Visna.
- (2) animals over one year of age were subjected to a diagnostic test for maedi-visna with negative results during the 30 days prior to shipment;
- (3) maedi-visna was neither clinically nor serologically diagnosed in the sheep and goats present in the flocks of origin during the past three years, and also that no sheep or goat from a flock of inferior health status was introduced into these flocks during that period.

### **M. OVINE EPIDIDYMITIS (*Brucella ovis*)**

- (1) the animals come from a sheep flock free from ovine epididymitis;
- (2) for sheep over six months of age, the animals were isolated in the establishment of origin for the 30 days prior to shipment and were subjected to the diagnostic tests for *Brucella ovis* (*B. ovis*) with negative results; or
- (3) for sheep from a flock other than that stated in point (1) above, the animals were isolated prior to shipment and were subjected to the diagnostic tests for *B. ovis* with negative results on two occasions, with an interval of 30 to 60 days between each test, the second test being performed during the 15 days prior to shipment.

### **N. Sheep Pox and Goat Pox**

- (1) were kept since birth, or for the past 21 days, in an establishment where no case of sheep pox and goat pox was officially reported during that period, and that the establishment was not situated in a sheep pox and goat pox infected zone; or
- (2) were kept in a quarantine station for the 21 days prior to shipment;
- (3) have not been vaccinated against sheep pox and goat pox; or
- (4) were vaccinated using a vaccine complying with the standards described in the Terrestrial Manual not less than 15 days and not more than 4 months prior to shipment (the nature of the vaccine used, whether inactivated or modified live virus, and the virus types and strains included in the vaccine shall also be stated in the certificate).

### **O. Blue Tongue**

- (1) the animals were kept in a country or zone either free or seasonally from bluetongue since birth or for at least 60 days prior to shipment; or
- (2) the animals were kept in a country or zone either free or seasonally free from bluetongue for at least 28 days, then were subjected, with negative results, to a serological test to detect antibodies to the BTV group and remained in the free country or zone until shipment; or
- (3) the animals were kept in a country or zone either free or seasonally free from bluetongue for at least 14 days, then were subjected, with negative results, to an agent identification test, and remained in the free country or zone until shipment; or
- (4) the animals:
  - (a) were vaccinated, at least 60 days before the introduction into the free country or zone, from which they are to be exported, against all serotypes demonstrated to be present in the source population through a surveillance programme as described in Articles 8.3.14. to 8.3.17.;
  - (b) were identified as having been vaccinated;
  - (c) remained in the free country or zone for at least seven days until shipment;

AND

- (5) if the animals were exported from a free zone within an infected country, either:

- a) did not transit through an infected zone during transportation to the place of shipment; or
- b) were protected from attacks from Culicoides in accordance with point 2 of Article 8.3.13. at all times when transiting through an infected zone; or
- c) had been vaccinated in accordance with point 4) above.

**P. Anthrax**

- (1) The animals were kept for the 20 days prior to shipment in an establishment where no case of anthrax was officially declared during that period; or
- (2) were vaccinated, not less than 20 days and not more than 12 months prior to shipment in accordance with the Terrestrial Manual.

**Q. Tuberculosis (*Mycobacterium tuberculosis*)**

- (1) infection with *M. tuberculosis* complex in animals is a notifiable disease in the entire country;
- (2) the goats showed no clinical signs of infection with *M. tuberculosis* complex on the day of shipment;

2. After examining the uploaded forms, Advance No Objection certificate (NOC (Annexure 6.2)) will be issued by the concerned Animal Quarantine and Certification Services.

### **On Arrival at the Port of Entry**

1. The Bovine(s) will be taken to the Quarantine Station and will remain under quarantine for 30 days.

### **During Quarantine Period at AQCS:**

1. Everyday examination record (Annexure 6.3) will be maintained and testing reports (against Bovine Viral Diarrhoea, Malignant catarrhal fever, Rift Valley Fever, Crimean-Congo Haemorrhagic Fever, Schmallenberg virus infection, Enzootic bovine leucosis) will be updated online. Samples will be drawn during 2<sup>nd</sup> week. The applicant will bear the charges for testing.
2. Final NOC (Annexure 6.4) will be issued in case negative test reports are obtained for the Bovines(s) under quarantine.
3. In case of the positive testing reports, deportation will be done at the cost of owner. If Bovine(s) dies, Post –Mortem and destruction will be done at the cost of owner.

##### **2.3 Vesicular stomatitis (VS)**

was kept since birth or for at least the past twenty-one days in a VS free country;

Or

animal was kept, since birth or for the past twenty-one days in an establishment where no case of VS was reported during last two years; and was kept in quarantine station for the thirty days prior to shipment and was subjected to diagnostic test for VS with negative results at least twenty-one days after the commencement of quarantine; and was protected from insect vectors during quarantine and transportation to the place of shipment.

##### **2.4 Rift valley fever (RVF)**

animal originates from a RVF free country.

##### **2.5 Lumpy skin disease (LSD)**

animal originates from a LSD free country.

##### **2.6 Contagious bovine pleuropneumonia (CBPP)**

animal originates from a CBPP free country.

##### **2.7. Bluetongue (BT)**

animal was kept in a BT free country since birth;

Or

the country of export (name of country) is not free from BT and animal was protected from Culicoides attacks in a vector protected Blue tongue virus (BTV) free establishment for at least twenty eight days and then subjected to a Competitive Enzyme Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA) test to detect antibody to the BTV group with negative results and remained in the Culicoides protected BTV free establishment until shipment.

### **2.8. Bovine tuberculosis**

animal originates from a herd free from Bovine tuberculosis located in a country or zone free from bovine tuberculosis;

Or

originates from a herd free from Bovine tuberculosis and was subjected to the tuberculin test for Bovine tuberculosis with negative results during thirty days prior to shipment;

or

has been isolated for at least ninety days in the quarantine and was subjected to two tuberculin tests (with a gap of minimum sixty days between the two tests) with negative results.

### **2.9. Paratuberculosis**

animal originates from Paratuberculosis free country;

or

originates from a herd that had no case of clinical Paratuberculosis in the last two years; and was subjected to Delayed Type Hypersensitivity (DTH) or Enzyme Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA) or Faecal Culture Test with negative result during thirty days prior to shipment.

### **2.10. Bovine brucellosis**

animal originates from Brucellosis free country;

or

originates from a herd in which no clinical sign of Bovine brucellosis was reported during the six months prior to shipment; and

originates from a zone free from Bovine brucellosis, or from a herd officially free from bovine brucellosis and was subjected to a serological test for bovine brucellosis with negative results during the thirty days prior to shipment;

or

originates from a herd free from bovine brucellosis and was subjected to Buffered Brucella Antigen or Complement Fixation, and ELISA tests with negative results during the thirty days prior to shipment;

if the bovine animal originates from a herd other than those mentioned above:

was isolated prior to shipment and was subjected to a serological test for bovine brucellosis (Buffered Brucella Antigen or Complement Fixation test, and Enzyme Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA), with negative results on two occasions, with an interval of not less than thirty days between each test, the second test being performed during the fifteen days prior to shipment. These tests are not considered valid in female animal which has calved during the past fourteen days.

### **2.11. Infectious bovine rhinotracheitis/Infectious pustularvulvo-vaginitis (IBR/IPV)**

animal originates from IBR/IPV free country;

or

animal originates from an IBR/IPV free herd;

or

was kept in a quarantine station for the thirty days prior to shipment and was subjected to a diagnostic test for Infectious bovine rhinotracheitis / Infectious Pustularvulvo-vaginitis (IBR/IPV) on a blood sample on two occasions with negative results, at an interval of not less than twenty one days.

### **2.12. Bovine genital campylobacteriosis**

animal originates from Bovine genital campylobacteriosis free country,

or

was kept in an establishment in which no case of Bovine genital campylobacteriosis has been declared-

(i) For female bovine

animal is either virgin heifer, or the culture of vaginal mucus for the presence of the causal agent proved negative.

(ii) For male bovine

has never been used for natural service, and microscopic examination of the culture of preputial washing and semen (for sexually mature animal) for the presence of the causal agent proved negative.

### **2.13. Trichomonosis**

animal originates from Trichomonosis free country;

or

was kept in a herd in which no case of Trichomonosis has been reported.

(i) For female bovine

animal is either virgin heifers, or the direct microscopic examination and culture of vaginal mucus for the presence of causal agent proved negative.

(ii) For male bovine

has never been used for natural service, and microscopic examination of the culture of preputial washing and semen (for sexually mature animals) for the presence of the causal agent proved negative.

#### **2.14. Enzootic bovine leucosis (EBL)**

originates from a country, zone or compartment free from EBL;

or

originates from a herd in which there has been no evidence of either clinical, post-mortem, or as a result of a diagnostic test for EBL within the previous two years;

or

all bovine animals over twenty four months of age were tested on two occasions while segregated from the herd in an isolation unit approved by the veterinary authority at an interval of four months with last test conducted within thirty days prior to shipment.

or

If less than two years of age the bovine animals come from 'Uterine' dams which have been subjected to a diagnostic test for EBL on a blood sample on two occasions within the preceding twelve months with last test conducted within thirty days prior to shipment; and the animal itself has been tested twice at an interval of at least thirty days between the tests with the last test conducted within thirty days prior to shipment.

#### **2.15. Bovine viral diarrhoea (BVD)**

before quarantine, animal was proved negative by virus isolation test or a test for virus antigen and,

after twenty one days in quarantine animal was subjected to virus isolation test or a test for virus antigen with negative result and no sero-conversion.

#### **2.16. Malignant catarrhal fever (MCF)**

originates from a country free from MCF;

or

originates from a herd that had no case of MCF in the last two years and was subjected to a diagnostic test with negative result during thirty days prior to shipment.

#### **2.17. Schmallerberg virus (SBV)**

Schmallerberg virus infection has never been recorded in the country;

or

before quarantine, all animals were proved negative by agent identification Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) and antibody detection Enzyme Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA) and after twenty one days in quarantine, animal(s) was again subjected to agent identification PCR and antibody detection ELISA with negative results.

## 2.18. Leptospirosis

the bovine animal was tested negative for all prevalent serovars of Leptospire prevalent in cattle in the exporting country by Microscopic Agglutination Test (MAT);

animal was given a complete course of treatment for leptospirosis.

## **Standard Operating Procedure for Import of Live Poultry(s) in to India.**

### **Pre Arrival Requirements:**

1. Minimum 07 days before embarkation, the application form (Annexure 15.1) will be submitted through Email by the applicant.
2. After examining the uploaded forms, Advance No Objection certificate (NOC-Annexure 15.2) will be issued by the concerned Animal Quarantine and Certification Services within 1 working day.

### **On Arrival at the Port of Entry**

1. The poultry will be taken to the premises approved by DAHD for in house quarantine and will remain under quarantine for 30 days.

### **During Quarantine Period**

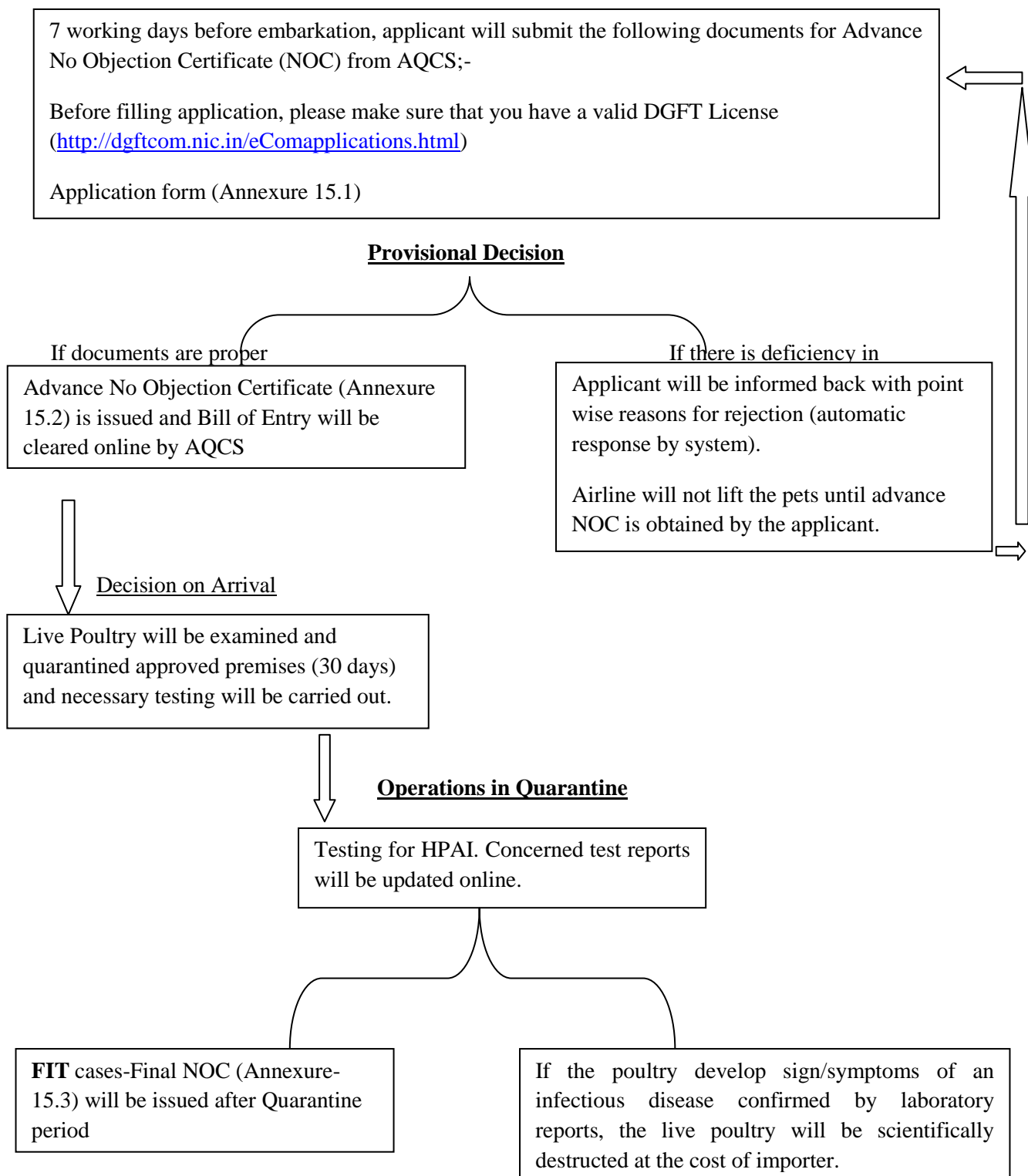
1. Everyday examination record will be inspected and testing reports (for HPAI) will be updated online. Samples will be drawn under the supervision of concerned quarantine officer. The applicant will bear the charges for testing.
2. Final NOC (Annexure 15.3) will be issued in case negative test reports are obtained for the live poultry(s) under quarantine.
3. In case of the positive testing reports, deportation/euthanization will be done at the cost of owner. If live poultry(s) dies, destruction will be done at the cost of owner.

**\*As per notification S.O. 1495(E), 10.06.2014, Live animals are allowed to be imported in Chennai, Kolkata, Mumbai and Delhi except for pet animals.**

(d) came from establishments and/or hatcheries which are recognized as being free from ILT & IB and from Hatcheries which comply with the standards to in Chapter 6.4 of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code.

(e) the eggs came from the ND free country, zone or compartment.

(f) the hatching eggs were derived from parent flocks which had been kept in ND free country, zone or compartment for at least 21 days prior to and at the time of collection of eggs and the eggs have had their surfaces sanitized (in accordance with Chapter 6.4 of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code)
