(a) to (b). There is no provision for setting up any centre under National Livestock Mission, Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund, Livestock Health and Disease Control Scheme and National Animal Disease Control Programme.

The National Livestock Mission (NLM) aims towards employment generation, entrepreneurship development, increase in per animal productivity and thus targeting increased production of meat, goat milk, egg and wool. During last three years, no funds has been released to the State under NLM.

The Government is implementing Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme (LHDCP) a central Sector Scheme in all states with the aim of reducing risk to animal health by prophylactic vaccination against diseases of animals, capacity building of Veterinary services, disease surveillance and strengthening veterinary infrastructure. The major activities supported are for the control of Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD), Brucellosis, Peste des Petits Ruminants (PPR) and Classical Swine Fever (CSF). The funding pattern is 100% central assistance for the same. Further States/UTs are supported for establishing and strengthening mobile veterinary units (MVUs); and Assistance to States for Control of economically important, exotic, emergent, and zoonotic animal diseases (ASCAD). Under Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme / National Animal Disease Control Programme, 2, 01, 95,218 animals have been ear-tagged in the state of Bihar. The vaccination programme is being run in the State for Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD). In the current round of FMD vaccination, 1, 89, 84,982 animals have been vaccinated as on 31.01.2023. The district-wise details are given in Annexure-I.

The projects sanctioned under Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund are given in Annexure-II along with the relevant details of the scheme.

Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund (AHIDF) is a Central Sector Scheme, a credit linked scheme with a corpus of INR 15000 crore. The Scheme was approved on 24/06/2020 which incentivizes investments by individual entrepreneurs, private companies, MSME, Farmers Producers Organizations (FPOs) and Section 8 companies to establish (i) the dairy processing and value addition infrastructure, (ii) meat processing and value addition infrastructure, (iii) Animal Feed Plant, (iv) Breed Improvement technology and Breed Multiplication Farm (v) Animal Waste to Wealth Management (Agri Waste Management) and (vi) Setting up of Veterinary Vaccine and Drugs Manufacturing facilities. The eligible entities which want to avail benefits under AHIDF need to taken loan from scheduled banks or NCDC. Eligible entities are eligible for interest subvention of 3% over a period of 8 years or till the time of loan repayment, whichever is earlier, with no limit on term loan amount. Under the scheme, term loan may be up to 90% of the project cost. Eligible MSMEs may avail 25% Credit Guarantee Coverage under the scheme.
